


- April 5: All students in kindergarten through fifth grade must be offered a hybrid option
- April 19: All remaining K-12 students must be offered a hybrid option

Health Processes and Procedures

Onsite Testing Pilot

- COVID test team will be deployed to school/work sites
- Testing is available to staff and students
- Testing is not mandatory
- Tests are self-administered oral swabs
- Test results are available within 2-3 days

Staff COVID Vaccinations

- K-12 staff are now eligible for vaccines in Washington state.
- Roughly 950 vaccines were administered at a HPS-specific vaccine clinic on March 7.
- Vaccination opportunities are posted and continually updated on Staff Hub.



Responding to COVID Cases

- Notify immediate supervisor of school or worksite
- Immediate supervisor completes COVID reporting form in Collab
- Health Services notifies/consults with Public Health
- Cabinet liaison notifies ILEDs and department leads for necessary school health and safety measures
- Any staff/students who were possibly exposed notified by school nurse and/or supervisor
- Determine deep-clean, closure, communication, or staffing needs, as needed

Classroom COVID Closures


A classroom will close and switch to distance learning for at least 10 days when:

- When two or more students or staff in same room/area test positive for COVID-19
- The cases have symptoms that start within 14 days of each other
- Someone was in close contact (within 6 ft. for 15 min. or more) with confirmed positive person
- The cases are not associated in another setting (household, club, etc.)

School Safety Plans


Each school has a comprehensive safety plan that continues to be revisited and refined throughout the months of March and early April




A joint safety team with HEA and Teamsters, including school nurses, reviews building safety plans







Transportation Plan

We will follow these safety practices on school buses:

- Masks are required
- Students will maintain the greatest distance possible on the bus. Students from the same household will be seated together whenever possible.
- All fans will be set to "outside air" and run constantly.
- Windows will be open for ventilation to the maximum feasible, depending on weather conditions.
- Roof vents will be open at all times



Prioritization of Alternative Assignments/Leaves

- 1. Employees with COVID
- 2. Employee exposed to COVID
- B. Employee caring for someone with COVID
- 4. High-risk employees
- High-risk individual in employee's household
- 6. Employees with children impacted by school closure
- 7. Employee cannot wear a face covering (requires ADA process)

Our Secondary Instructional Model

Key Factors and Drivers

- Mental wellbeing of students
- Health and safety of students and adults
- Academic and SEL growth
- Ensuring equitable access to instruction

HOW?

- For students who choose in-person, 30% of instructional hours for the week will be in-person and on campus
- All students, remote or in-person, have daily interaction with the classroom teacher and classmates
- Safety plans designed and refined based on campus context
